### V. ADA Litigation

Reasonable Accommodation

- EEOC v. Echo Star Communications Corp., filed by Denver District (2002).
- Pre v. Post Offer Administration
  - Disability-based/medical testing must be post-offer
  - Area of ADA that is widely recognized and relatively straightforward
  - Disability not required for standing
